On behalf of the Braggs History Project, please allow me to offer our sincere sympathies in the death of Mrs. Billye Patrick.

While I have personally known the Patrick family all my life, I "met" Billye as I worked on the Braggs books.

She and Gary were very proud of the family's long history in our town. First, when J.J. Patrick operated a store and post office on the Arkansas River. Records in the National Archives list him as the postmaster of Patrick, Indian Territory. Later, as the town moved inland by the railroad, he operated a store and played a prominent role in the town's early days.

His son, Grover, and all nine of his grandsons, served their country in the armed forces.

Billye was always generous to lend a hand to help and support us. Their family's story is like a thread running through the fabric of our town's history.

She was devoted to her husband and family. To them, once more, we send our condolences and great appreciation not just for this story but for the lady who helped tell it so well.
