



Gordon Stanley 'Mike' Harman

May 14, 1937 - May 25, 2024

Gordon Stanley Harman, better known as “Mike” to his many loved ones, was born on May 14, 1937 in Abbs Valley, Virginia, to John and Flora (Frazier) Harman, and passed away on May 25, 2024, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 87 years. On February 20, 1958, he married Peggy Ann Roark. Together, they built a beautiful life for themselves and their three children. They were married 62 years at the time of her passing on September 5, 2020.

In 1954, at the young age of 17, Gordon joined the United States Air Force. Gordon dedicated his life in service to his country, achieving the distinguished rank of Chief Master Sergeant. Gordon’s 24-year Air Force career sent him to several duty stations within the United States and abroad, including a one-year tour in Vietnam, where he was awarded the Bronze Star medal in recognition of his outstanding service. His enlistment in the Air Force ignited his love of travel and he especially enjoyed his trips to Japan to play tourist. His commitment, leadership and dedication to duty inspired those around him and left an indelible mark on all who knew him. He pursued his education while enlisted in the Air Force and earned a bachelor’s degree in business administration and economics from Park College. In 1978, upon his retirement from the Air Force, Gordon, led by his inherent ambition and love of learning, began law school at the University of Tulsa College of Law. In the second half of his life, Gordon enjoyed his work as an attorney in Tulsa, OK, until his retirement in 2006.

Gordon was an avid outdoorsman. He especially loved hunting, fishing and

hiking. On these many hiking trips, his endurance impressed his fellow Airmen, earning him the nickname "Mountain Goat" Harman. He enjoyed many hunting and fishing excursions throughout his life and he credited his love of the outdoors for keeping him active. Later in life, he stayed active with his grandchildren during countless trips to local parks, hunting and fishing trips and time spent at the gun range. A treasured memory was hunting alongside his grandsons when they each snagged their first deer and turkey.

A man of integrity, loyalty and strength, Gordon touched the lives of many with his kindness, generosity and wisdom. He was the epitome of a gentleman. His memory will be cherished by all who had the privilege of knowing him.

Gordon is preceded in death by his lovely wife Peggy Ann Harman.

He is survived by his three children, a son, Dennis Harman of Hulbert; two daughters, Anna Demoss (Darryl) of Coweta and Cynthia Mist Marsh-Harman (Tally) of Tulsa. He is also survived by his grandchildren, Lindsay Harman King (OJ) of Bixby; Tyler Harman of Oklahoma City; Dylan Harman of Tahlequah; Samuel Moran of Albuquerque, New Mexico; Sarah Moran of Drumwright; great-grandchildren Landry Skye King, who he affectionately called "my girl"; Zade Tyler Harman; Colton Moran; and Ashlyn Baucom; two siblings, Sallie Harman of Abbs Valley, Virginia, and Garland Harman (Pat) of Columbia, South Carolina; extended family; and many friends.

“ Mike, our mutual friend, Paul LaMarche, and I were all stationed together in the USAF at Bartlesville OK, and then went overseas together to Osan Korea in the 1950s. It was not until we reconnected in 2010 via the internet that I really started to appreciate just what an amazing person my friend Mike was. Paul and I, although disconnected after leaving the USAF, had both elected to become engineers, curtesy of the GI bill. Mike on the other hand had elected to become a lawyer – although he had never gone past the 9th grade in high school. When I knew him in the military, he seemed to me to be one more guy in my life – maybe a bit more skillful socially, and better looking than the next GI, but not extraordinary. But by then, it had become clear to me that Mike’s life was an extraordinary story. By May of 2017, we three guys had decided to have a reunion in Bartlesville. It was not until then that I fully appreciated just what an unusual guy Mike was. Most of his life consisted of living with unloving relatives, in orphanages or on the streets. Yet he was clearly way brighter and ambitious than I had suspected, and despite his severe upbringing – or maybe because of it – a very compassionate guy. These factors, along with the fact that we shared severe childhoods, with too much time living outside our homes in places like orphanages and unloving relatives, brought us closer together than ever.
