Jimmy Duane Trusley, 79, of Mannford, OK was born December 2, 1946, in Oklahoma City, OK to James Andrew and Helen Marie (Main) Trusley and passed away Thursday, February 12, 2026, in Tulsa, OK.

Jimmy was raised in multiple states where, regardless of his address, he and his family built a life rooted in hard work and friendship.
