Judy (Judith Elaine) Nichols passed away on Tuesday, February 17, 2015, at Northeastern Health System, Tahlequah, OK, in the presence of her family, surrounded by love and prayers. Judy courageously battled ALS-- Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease, for the past 15 months.

Judy was born on June 22, 1946, in Holdenville, Oklahoma. Judy graduated from Broken Arrow High School in 1964 where she met the love of her life Randy. She attended Oklahoma State University for two years before graduating with her bachelor's and master's degrees in education at Northeastern State University. After beginning her career in education at Broken Arrow Elementary School for 3 years and Locust Grove for 4 years, Judy relocated to Fort Gibson where she served as a third grade teacher for 19 years, a middle school civics teacher for 3 years and ultimately as the assistant principal of the middle school for 14 years. Throughout her 43 years in education, she made a lasting impact in the lives of countless students, teachers, administrators, staff, and parents. An active member of the Fort Gibson community, Judy served on the Board of Trustees, ultimately serving as the Mayor of Fort Gibson. Judy was truly an incredible person with such a giving heart. Her joy in life was caring for her family and her students. She was a bright soul that lit up any room she entered. Judy will be remembered for always being there to provide comfort, guidance, and encouragement.

Judy will be fondly remembered for her loving and nurturing presence in many lives and will be greatly missed.

Judy was preceded in death by her parents Harold and Willie (Dees) Murry and her brother Bill Murry all of Broken Arrow, OK. Judy is survived by her high school sweetheart, a devoted and loving husband, Randy Nichols. She is survived by her loving sons, Jason Nichols and wife Robyn of Broken Arrow; and Jacob Nichols and wife Lindsay of Fort Gibson. Her favorite role was Grandma to her grandsons, Justin Nichols and Aaron Nichols, and her granddaughter Claire Nichols.
