



## Melvin Gene 'Mel' Howell

October 19, 1948 - July 11, 2024

Melvin Gene Howell, a beloved resident of Fort Gibson, Oklahoma, passed away peacefully on Thursday, July 11, 2024 at his home with his wife and sons by his bedside. Mel was born October 19, 1948 in Erick, Oklahoma, the son of Elmer and Wilma Howell and raised in Sweetwater, Oklahoma, where he graduated High School. He then completed his education at Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Oklahoma.

Mel enlisted in the United States Army on April 25, 1968, in Oklahoma City, embarking on a remarkable journey of service and dedication. During his time in the Army, Mel displayed immense courage and valor as a field medic for the first platoon of A Company, 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry Regiment of the 101st Airborne Division. He bravely served in the Vietnam War from September 1968 to December 1969, including the infamous battle on Hill 937 lasting from May 10 through May 20 in 1969, also known as Hamburger Hill. Mel's exceptional service earned him numerous accolades, including the Combat Medical Badge, Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal, Vietnam Gallantry Anose with Palm, Vietnam Civil Actions Honor Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with Cluster, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Ribbon with Unit Citation, Presidential Unit Emblem, Meritorious Unit Emblem, Valorous Unit Embalm, Expert Badge with M-16 and Sharpshooter Badge with M-14 reflecting his unwavering commitment to his fellow soldiers and his country.

Mel understood the true cost of freedom, and he paid that price with his

unwavering dedication. Mel fought not only for his own freedom but for the freedom of future generations. He fought to ensure that the values we hold dear; liberty, justice, and equality, would endure. Mel is not just a veteran; he is a symbol of courage, resilience, and unwavering commitment. Mel stood tall against adversity, facing the challenges of war with bravery and honor. He exemplified the values of duty, honor, and sacrifice, and his service will forever be remembered. On November 21, 1979, Mel married the love of his life, Karen Stangle, in Muskogee, Oklahoma. Together, they built a life filled with love, laughter, and shared passions. Mel found his calling as an educator, dedicating 13 years of his life to teaching at Hilldale High School in Muskogee, Oklahoma. As the head of the math department for 10 years, Mel was renowned for his excellence in teaching, earning the prestigious Teacher of the Year award three times. Mel was not just a teacher; he was a beacon of knowledge, a mentor, and a guide. He possessed a unique ability to unlock the potential within each student, nurturing their curiosity, and instilling in them a lifelong love for learning. Mel understood that education was not just about imparting information, but about empowering young minds to reach their full potential. Mel had a passion for teaching that was infectious. He created a classroom environment that was nurturing, inclusive, and filled with a sense of wonder. Mel fostered a love for learning, inspiring his students to explore, question, and discover. He instilled in them the belief that knowledge is power and that education is the key to unlocking a world of possibilities. But Mel's impact extended far beyond the classroom. He was a mentor, a friend, and a source of inspiration to his colleagues. He shared his expertise generously, always striving to elevate the standards of education. Mel understood the importance of collaboration and the power of a supportive community of educators working together to shape the future. He made a lasting impact on his community by sponsoring SADD and participating in the school's talent shows, bringing smiles to all with his energetic performances of ZZ Top cover songs. Beyond his professional achievements, Mel was a man of many interests and talents. He had a passion for music, often playing in a band on

the weekends with Bob Barker playing mandolin and Mike Williams on banjo or recording music with Bryan his younger son. He loved his Datson Custom 280z, and working alongside Paul (his elder son) on old cars, fast cars, and motorcycles. In 1983, Mel began taking annual motorcycle trips with his brother and other buddies. In 1995, Karen became his travel partner and they visited all the states West of the Mississippi except Washington and most of the Southern States. Then, he would like to slow down on the golf course. Mel cherished his friends and family, finding joy in every moment life had to offer. Mel's legacy as a veteran, teacher, friend, father, and husband will continue to inspire all who knew him. His kindness, compassion, and zest for life touched the hearts of many, leaving a profound impact on all who had the privilege of crossing paths with him. Melvin Gene Howell will be dearly missed, but his memory will forever live on in the hearts of those who were fortunate enough to know him.

Mel's viewing will be Noon-7:00PM on Tuesday, July 16, 2024 at Clifford D Garrett Family Funeral Home in Muskogee.

A celebration of Mel's life will be held 10:30AM Wednesday, July 17, 2024 at Clifford D Garrett Family Funeral Home Chapel, in Muskogee, Oklahoma with his family officiating. Michael Ritchey, Mike Williams, Garrett Howell, Christy Breau, Johnathon Field, and Corbin Stewart will serve as casket bearers.

Committal prayers and interment will follow at Fort Gibson National Cemetery

with full Military Honors being observed.
