To her students, she wasn't just a teacher—she was a mentor, a cheerleader, and often a second mother whose kindness they carried with them long after leaving her classroom.

What truly made Rudena shine was her generosity and the way she made people feel seen and loved. Her home was a haven—especially in the summer, when neighborhood kids knew they were always welcome to splash and play in her pool. Those carefree afternoons filled with giggles, cannonballs, and shared popsicles created memories that still warm hearts

today. For many years, she also shared her home and heart with her beloved Yorkies, whose energy and loyal companionship brought her endless joy. She delighted in opening her door and her heart to family, friends, furry companions, and anyone who needed a kind word or a listening ear.

Above all, Rudena's greatest treasure was her family.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Jim McPherson; her parents, Rudolf and Edna Krausse; and her brother, Edwin.

“Mrs. McPherson was my 5th grade teacher at Harris Jobe in 1998-1999. She was one of my all time favorite teachers and had a big influence on my life. I have many memories from her class: The year I had her for 5th grade we had a combined class of 4th and 5th grade together. It was a ploy of sorts to save our little school that was always being threatened of shut down due to low numbers, but it felt really fun and innovative! She managed it gracefully. She taught us all the states and capitals and we would play a fun, competitive game to see who knew the most. We did a Christmas project and Mr. McPherson cut wood in the shape of stockings and angels for each student. We painted them and wrote “Merry Christmas” in cursive on them. We visited the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum. She prepared us for the 5th grade writing test by having us do practice writing prompts often. She gave personal feedback to every student. I remember sitting 1:1 with her at her desk going over my essays. She encouraged me very much! She even had me read a few of my essays to the class. She truly set me up for success at a young age by teaching me how to write a paper well. My grandmother lived in Country Club. I think they might have been friends, but I also remember going to swim at Mrs. McPherson’s a few times with my grandmother. She added me on Facebook a few years ago and she would often comment on my posts about my children and my own experiences as an educator now. I enjoyed reconnecting with her in that way. I was blessed to have her as a teacher and as a part of my life. They don’t make them like her anymore! One of a kind for sure.
