Timothy Linus Dickmann, 56, of Claremore, OK was born December 18, 1967, to Landon Joseph and Barbara Patricia (Dennehy) Dickmann in Phoenix, AZ and passed away Monday, June 24, 2024. Timothy grew up attending Vian Public Schools before transferring to Muskogee High School where he graduated with the class of 1986. After graduation, he joined the United States Air Force to serve our Nation, enlisting on January 15, 1988, in Oklahoma City, OK. He received the AF Outstanding Unit Award, AF Organizational Excellence Award, AF Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, AF Longevity Service Award Ribbon, NCO Prof Military Education Grad Ribbon, Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon and AF Training Ribbon. Timothy was honorably discharged on September 1, 1993, at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Arizona with a rank of E-4. He enjoyed the outdoors. Timothy loved to camp, and some of his best memories were made at Sequoyah State Park. He was an avid OU football fan, and was instrumental in overseeing the Sooner State Rodeo in Tulsa. After the military, he worked at the family business, Dickmann Glass. He went on to own and operate the Tulsa Eagle, a bar in downtown Tulsa. He will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

Timothy was preceded in death by his parents; his sister, Cathy Peterson; and brother, Robert Dickmann.

He is lovingly survived by his partner, Scott Gouard of the home; brothers, David and Lanny Dickmann both of Muskogee, OK; sisters, Trish Dickmann of

Oklahoma City, OK, and Cindy Lehman of Fort Gibson, OK; many nieces, nephews, extended family and many friends.

A celebration of Timothy's life will be held 1PM Sunday, July 21, 2024, at Tulsa Eagle in Tulsa, OK.
